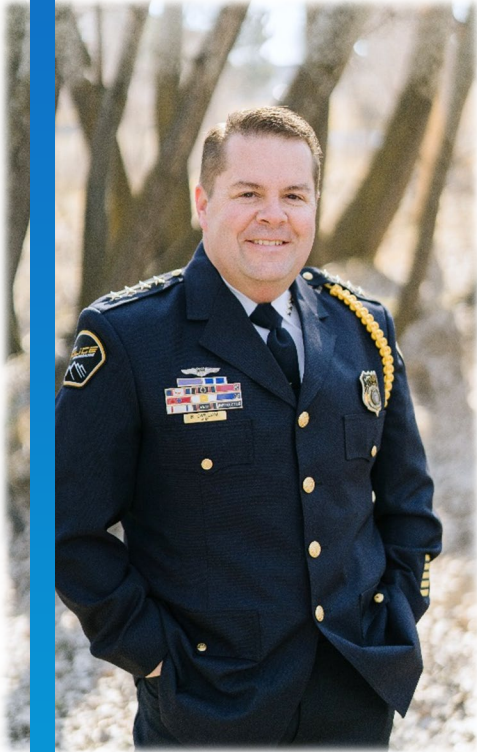


Lone Peak Police Department Organizational Chart

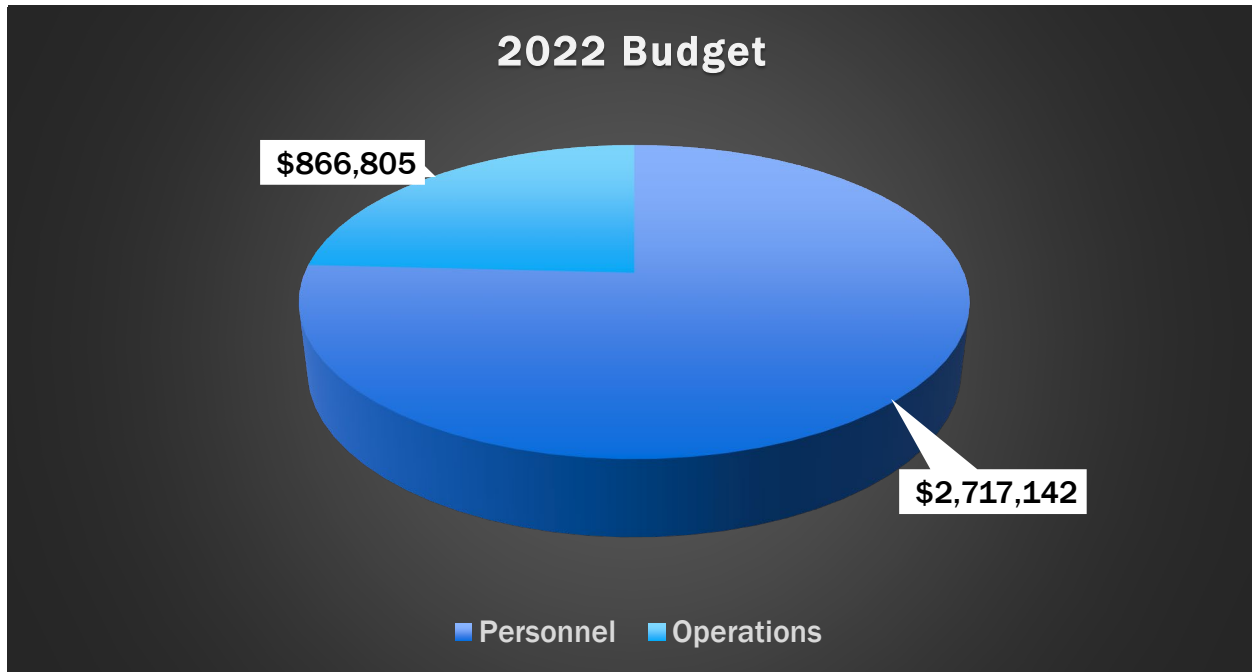

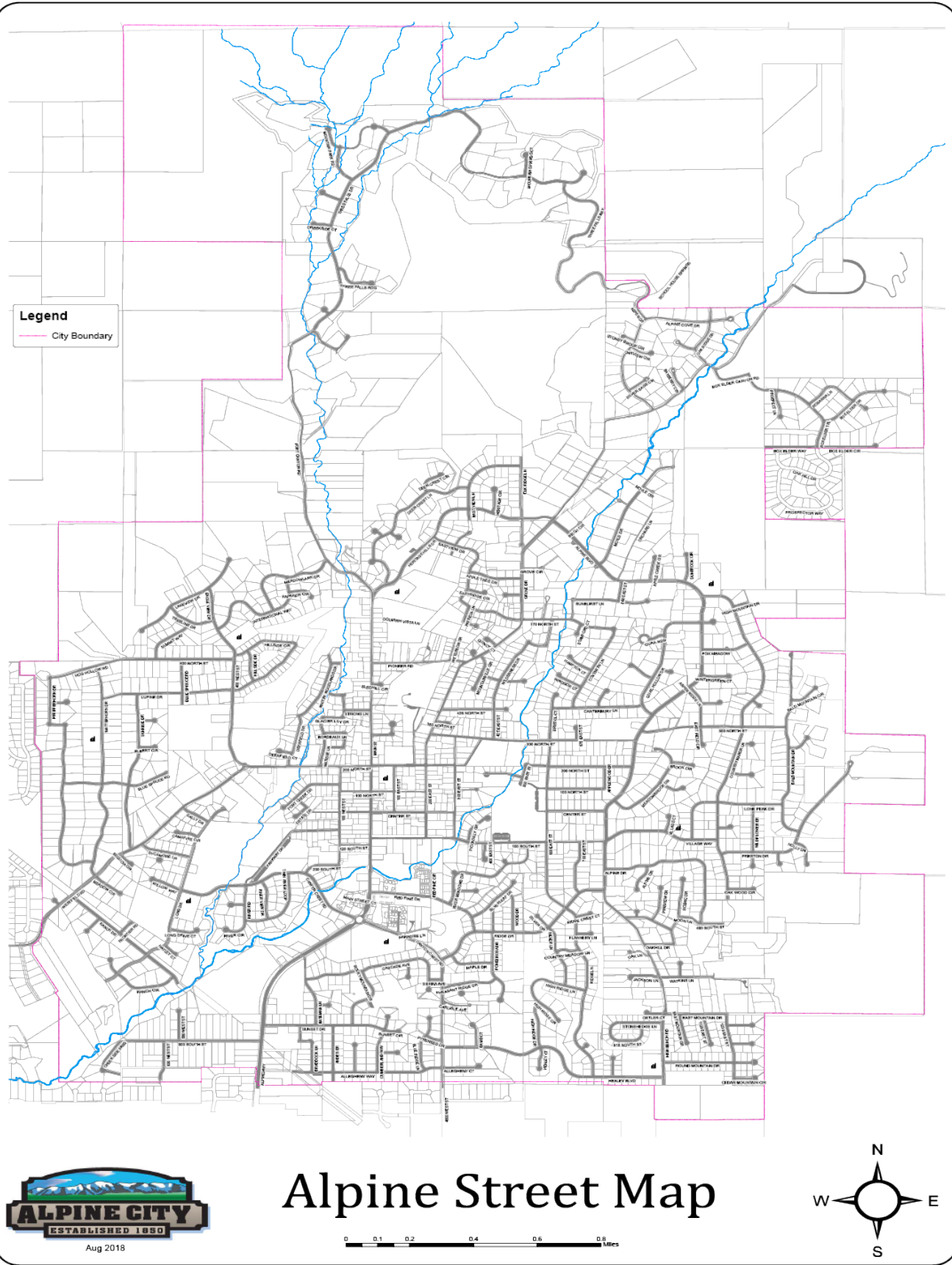

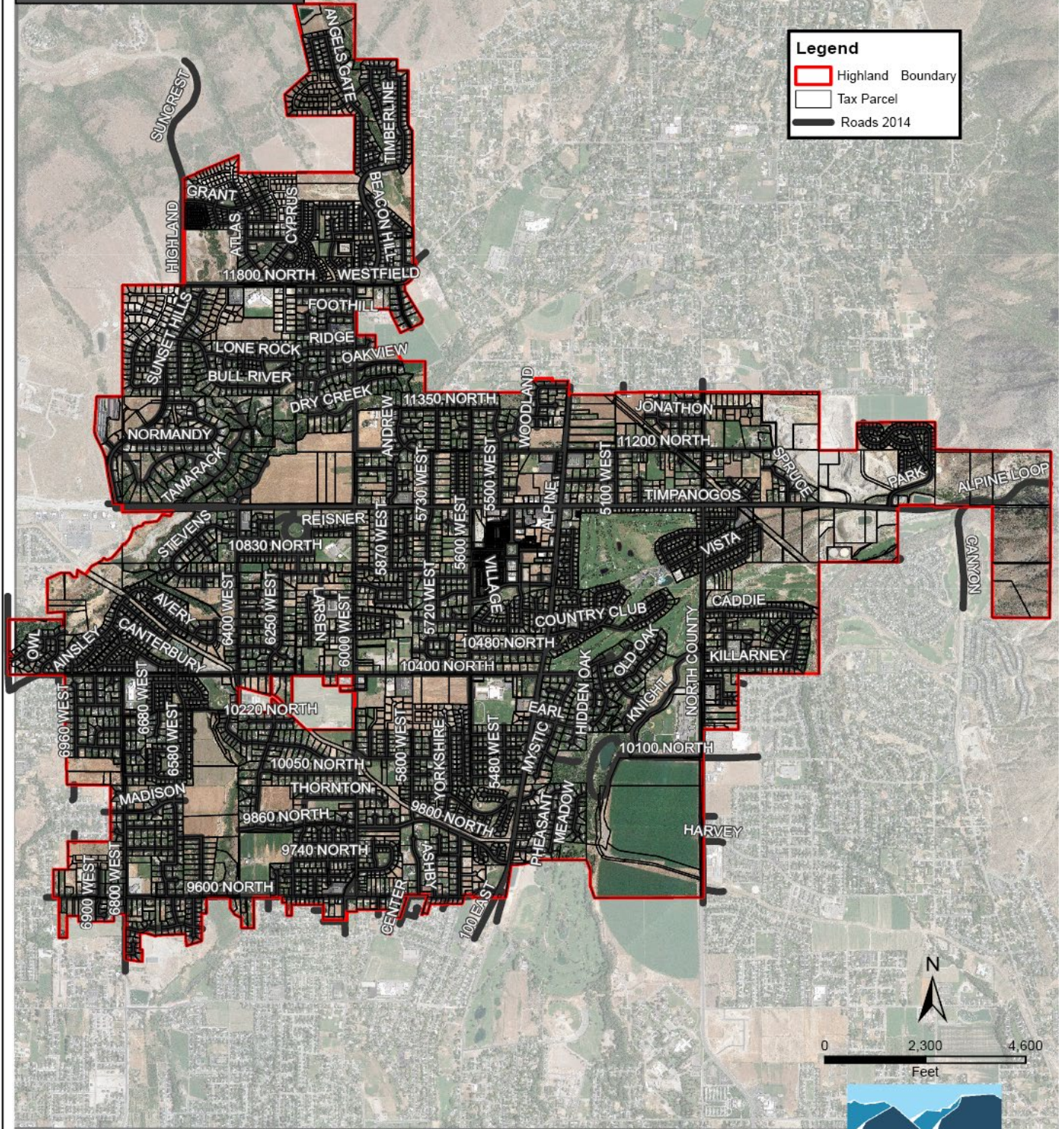

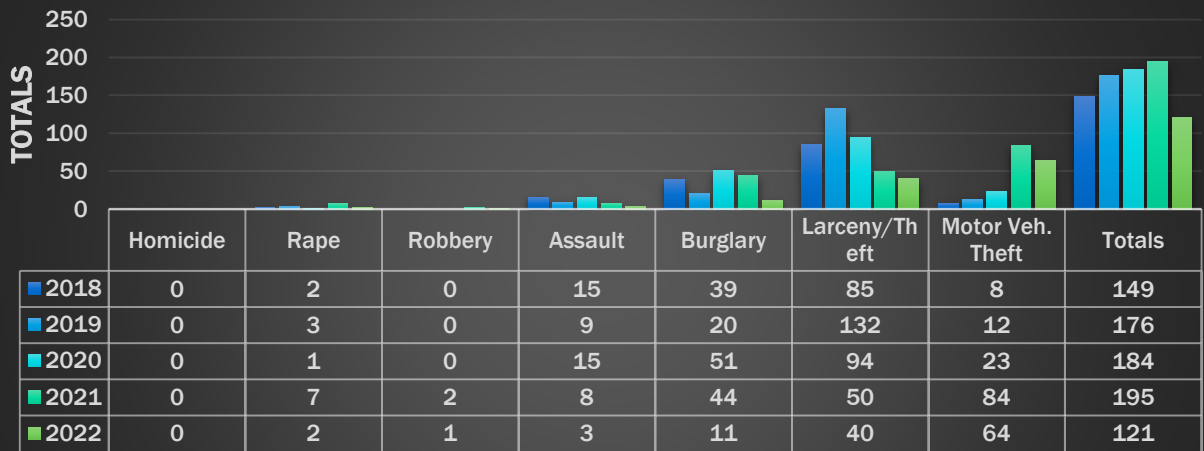

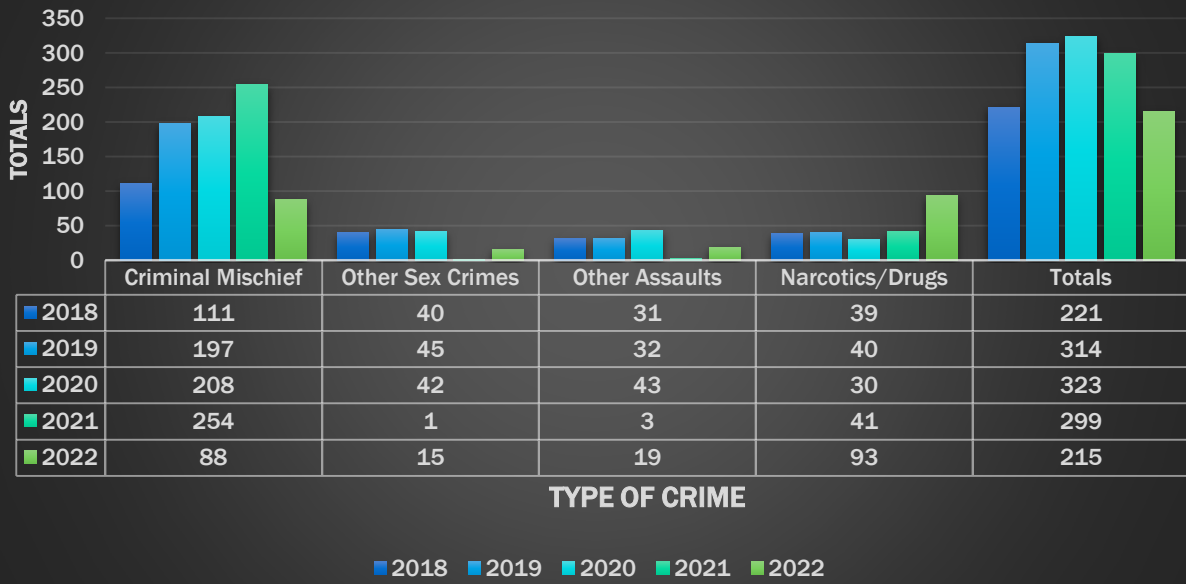
2022 Part I Crimes in Alpine & Highland



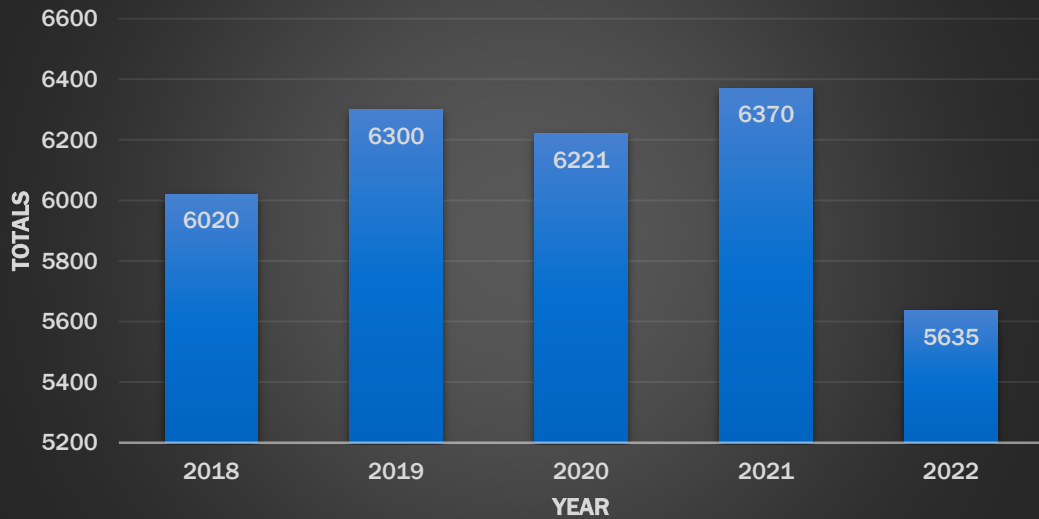
TYPE OF CRIME
